Remembrance Sunday 8th November 2020

On Remembrance Sunday this year, we will still be within the coronavirus firebreak lockdown period, although the Welsh Government have made an exception for small organised Remembrance Sunday commemorations. Attendance is restricted to a maximum of thirty people, which includes the event organisers. The City Council have arranged a short Act of Remembrance, followed by wreath laying, which will be strictly by invitation only, so that we can stay within the legal limit. We have invited the Armed Forces, Emergency Services and Community Organisations to lay a wreath to represent our community. The Mayor will lay a wreath on behalf of the City of St Asaph. Unfortunately, members of the public will not be able to attend the Commemoration.

We would ask residents to stand on their doorstep at 11.00 am to observe a two-minute silence to honour the fallen and injured heroes and for the community to come together. We would also ask you to support the Royal British Legion in any way you can. If you would like to lay a wreath at the Cenotaph, you will, of course, be able to do so privately later in the day, after the official wreath laying is over.

It will be a very different Remembrance this year and we are really sorry that the whole community will not be able to take part, however the City Council were determined that we must pay our respects to the fallen.
